Texas Council on Family Relations 2021 Virtual Student Poster Competition

Poster Proposal Deadline: December 15th

Open to Undergraduate & Graduate Students

The TxCFR Conference Committee and Student New Professional Program (SNPP) invites proposals for the student poster competition. Proposals on all family related topics are welcome. However, submissions related to the conference theme, *Promoting Resilient Families: Texas Family Support Systems*, are especially encouraged.

First place will be awarded for each category with at least three entries. If there are more than five entries within a category, then second place will also be awarded. If there are less than three entries in either category, the categories will be collapsed to create one category.

Graduates and undergraduates will not compete against each other. If a student is an undergraduate at the time of submission (Fall 2020) but begins a graduate program in January 2021, the student will automatically be entered into the undergraduate category (as the work was completed as an undergraduate) unless the student specifies that they wish to compete at the graduate level.

PROPOSALS MAY BE SUBMITTED IN THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

RESEARCH POSTER

 Completed Research Study (With Results)

CONTENT POSTER

- Research Proposal (No Results)
- Literature Review
- White Paper or Position Paper (Persuasive)

PROPOSALS SHOULD INCLUDE:

- A 300 500 word description of the research or content of the poster
- 3 highlights/objectives from the project: What are 3 things that attendees should know about this poster?
- A connection to research, theory, policy, and/or practice

Submit at tx.ncfr.org until December 15th.

Proposals will be reviewed after the deadline. Notifications will be sent in early January. The virtual poster competition will be held from March 2nd - March 5th, 2021, during the Texas Council on Family Relations 2021 Annual Conference.
